

Native Witch Hazel BOTANICAL NAME

Turraea pubescens

Habitat/Ecology	Dry and littoral rainforests (Mt Archer and Mt Etna); softwood scrubs.
Home use	Perfumed (like Witch Hazel). Attracts butterflies & birds.
Habit	Shrub-small tree to 5 m, deciduous at times.
Flowers/Fruit	<i>Flowers</i> : September to January; masses of white tubular flowers cover tree; perfumed. <i>Fruit</i> : February to August; star-shaped on
	opening exposing black seeds.
Leaves/Stems	Leaves: 3-10.5 cm x 2-5.8 cm; absent/immature when flowering. Bark: Grev to reddish brown.
Description	
Propagation	Fresh seeds; slow growing.
Water/Shade	Little water and well-drained soils; hot, dry and sheltered areas; prefers shade.
Maintenance	No maintenance; can be pruned after flowering.
